

As spring arrives and temperatures rise, the igusa begins to grow rapidly. To keep the tall rushes upright and maintain their quality, we drive stakes into the fields and set up support nets.

Most of the stakes are installed by hand. It is physically demanding work, and we carefully adjust the angle and depth of each stake so that it will not loosen later. This is where experience and craftsmanship truly matter.

When the stakes and nets are set correctly, the igusa grows straight, allowing sunlight to reach all the way down to the base of the plants.

The igusa then grows strong and healthy, with each individual rush developing a beautiful, natural green color.
